Val's Report

As requested by the committee I have approached Spire Reds for a possible merger, but they said no.

Proposed amendment to the constitution

10 Dissolution

- A resolution to dissolve the club can only be passed at an AGM or EGM through a majority of the membership.

Questions brought forward to the committee-

• Is it a bigger problem than just getting more coaches?

Val - Yes we need to spread the load of the current committee members across more people. If more people join then we need certain training to be carried out such as safe guarding, DBS checks and GDPR knowledge.

• How long are the coaching courses?

Val- Level 1 is a virtual course. Level 2 is 3 weekends. You need to be working within the netball industry for 2 years and have certain qualifications such as first aid and safe guarding.

If anyone is interested, we do have details we can hand out.

A learning agreement can be signed as we will help pay for course, but you will need to stay for 2 years.

• Do you run a senior team and can they help train the younger groups?

Val-Yes, this is what we have in place and that is where our coaches have come from. They have decided they do not wish to coach anymore as they want to play.
